

UPDATE ON PROPOSED ROAD THROUGH DOGBONE MEADOW

he Board of Directors of Friends of Dogbone Meadow will be meeting with the Community Garden Group and City Hall in early May. To prepare for the meeting, we have brought in certified arborists to discuss potential damage to the Heritage Oak and the problems associated with moving six grown trees from the area where the proposed road would go. We also talked to the original contractor, Bob Lewis, who has told us the proposed road

is too close to the irrigation manifold, among other problems.

We will be interested to hear if the Community Garden group has any alternatives to their plan; if not, we have a couple of suggestions. Shortly after the meeting there will be a report posted on the bulletin board; the report will also appear in the next newsletter.
